Sara Steele is a passionate artist and activist, an extraordinary watercolorist who works in her Philadelphia, PA, studio. Ms. Steele is self-taught but clearly well-studied in the works of twentieth-century artists. Her paintings have been shown in more than 50 solo and scores of group exhibitions in the U.S. and internationally. Her work has been widely published for over 30 years in books, exhibition catalogs, magazines, and chapbooks. Her books include *Blueprints for Paradise: The Watercolor Paintings of Sara Steele*, *Discovering the Five Elements*, and *In Bloom: The Floral Watercolors of Sara Steele*.
